## Health

Existing Facilities—Hospitals

The Harpenden Memorial Hospital in Carlton Road is now under the control of the Luton and Hitchin Group (No. 2) Management Committee and provides 29 beds. (145)

Facilities proposed by Hospital Board

The Management Committee have not yet disclosed their future proposals, if any, for the town. (146)

Proposed H.C.C. facilities

The County Council have already authorised the purchase of No. 40 Luton Road as a medical welfare centre for North Harpenden, and another centre will probably be required for the remainder of the town, possibly in the grounds of the hospital. (147)

## Welfare

This service is on a County basis. Proposals in Harpenden for housing old persons will be made when suitable properties become available. (148)

## Children

There are two children's homes, one at St. Margaret's, Crossways, and the other at Field House, Townsend Road. There is also a large voluntary children's home at North Harpenden run by the National Children's Home and Orphanage. There are no further proposals at present.

## Fire, Ambulance and Police

The existing facilities have already been referred to in paragraph 61. (150)

It is understood that the new Fire and Ambulance stations to be erected at St. Albans and in the two villages of Redbourn and Wheathampstead will provide some measure of cover for Harpenden. (151)
